Humberside Police Federation are purchasing and equipping a welfare van to be used by police officers and staff when deployed at cordons and incident scenes. There will also be an option to utilise at public events and open days, when not in use to support the welfare of personnel.

The vehicle will be equipped with a number of facilities including toilet, hot and cold water, hot water boiler, USB charging points, seating area, solar panels, awning and fridge.
