

Dear , thank you for your Freedom of Information request submitted on 31 December 2012. Please find below the information that you have requested.

The role of Deputy Police and Crime Commissioners were created under the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011. Under Section 18 of that Act all Commissioner's have the power to appoint a Deputy and a number across the Country have opted to appoint to this position.

The reasons why Mr Grove felt it necessary to appoint a Deputy are set out in the report that was submitted to the Police and Crime Panel, a copy of which is attached.

The Deputy is contracted to work 4 days (30 hours) per week and will receive a salary of £45,000 a year. Details of his salary and the job specification were included within the report submitted to the Police and Crime Panel. Decision Record 6/2012 outlines the decision to appoint a Deputy and Decision Record 9/2012 outlines consideration of the Police and Crime Panel's report.
