

Dear, thank you for your further request for information.

1. Total number of households/CT bills liable for the Humberside Police precept.

The total number of households, based on information provided by the 4 local authorities, is 423,478.

2. Does 22.1% turnout figure at last PCC election take into account or rule out the 4/5000 spoiled ballot papers

The elections are run by the Police Area Returning Officer who, at the last election, was the Chief Executive of the East Riding of Yorkshire Council and any information in relation to turn out/electoral roll figures would therefore need to be obtained from them. Details of the election results are, however, posted on the Police and Crime Panel website and show that there were 156,502 ballot papers which represented a turnout of 22.84% <http://www.northlincs.gov.uk/your-council/about-your-council/committees-and-cabinet/humberside-police-and-crime-panel/#>.

If you think that we have not supplied information in accordance with our Publication Scheme or under general rights of access then you have the right to ask for an internal review. Any request for an internal review should be made within 30 days and addressed to:
