

1. Executive Summary

The purpose of this report is to update the Police and Crime Commissioner on activity carried out by Independent Custody Visitors acting on his behalf as part of the Humberside Independent Custody Visiting Scheme.

2. Recommendation(s)

It is recommended that the Police and Crime Commissioner:

- i. Notes the content of this report, with specific focus on the information contained within Appendix A, and
- ii. Agrees changes to the local scheme administration as set out in the 'Scheme Developments' and 'Financial Information' section, particularly the discretionary payments for Panel Administrators, and
- iii. Agrees to receive similar update reports (suggested 6-monthly in November and May going forwards)

3. Background

Independent Custody Visiting Schemes are an audit and assurance function whereby independent volunteers visit those detained in police custody in order to ensure that their welfare, rights and entitlements under PACE (Code C) are being met.

The Schemes became the statutory responsibility of Police Authorities in the Police Reform Act 2002, these responsibilities transferred over to Police and Crime Commissioners in the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011.

Custody Visitors are entirely voluntary and work to a national Code of Practice agreed and administered by the national Independent Custody Visiting Associated (ICVA), the Code is regularly updated to reflect policy and landscape changes, and ICVA provide local training session for new volunteers and refresher training as and when required.

4. Local Scheme

The Humberside Scheme continues to operate with 21 volunteers across the area, currently still divided into the old policing 'divisions' (or local authority areas) for ease of administration. There are currently four designated custody suites to be visited, Grimsby, Scunthorpe, Clough Road and Bridlington.

Attached at Appendix A is a breakdown summary of the visits carried out in 2015, this breakdown shows the number of detainees in each custody suite and the number consenting to a visit. It also shows the Visitors general comments on the physical conditions of the custody environment and whether the detainees had any issues they wanted to raise along with any matters that were raised with the custody staff or Sgt for immediate action.

5. Scheme Developments

The information in Appendix A shows a marked difference in the volume of visits carried out across different areas, visit rosters are produced and distributed to Visitors by the OPCC on a six-monthly basis. The disparity in numbers of visits can be attributed in some way to the Scheme losing a number of Visitors from both the Hull and Scunthorpe area over the year, and, sadly, one visitor passing away. These issues were compounded by the limited administration support for the Scheme within the OPCC, resulting in rosters and panel details not being updated and circulated in a timely manner for the areas.

Administration support for the scheme has recently increased, and there are plans to arrange two networking events with the Visitors before Christmas. The aim of these events will be to explore the option of merging the Grimsby and Scunthorpe Visitors and the Hull and East Riding Visitors into a Northbank and a Southbank panel. Plans for this have been previously floated with the Visitors, and most were receptive and positive about the proposed changes. These proposals will also include a 'Panel Administrator' role for one of the volunteers in each of the areas to take on extra duties and provide extra support to the OPCC with updating contact details, chasing up missed visits, rosters, etc.

Networking events will be re-introduced on a six-monthly basis in the first instance, with a view to increasing in frequency if the Visitors deem it necessary. The interest of the Commissioner and the Scheme continue to be represented at a strategic level through the Force Custody Board, and there are now plans for the day-to-day support of the ICV Scheme to link in with the Custody User Group where force custody leads, custody sergeants and detention officers meet to discuss delivery of daily custody business, raise queries and concerns, share good practice, react to policy and practice changes, etc.

6. Financial Implications

The plans to merge the Visitors into two panels, from the existing four, will result in a small increase in mileage claims for the Visitors who will be visiting custody suites slightly further away from their home addresses. The re-introduction of 'Panel Administrators' will also incur some incidental expense costs, such as postage, telephone calls, printing, etc. and it is suggested that the Panel Administrators be given a quarterly discretionary payment for out of pocket expenses of £25, this should cover all costs associated with being the Volunteer Panel Administrator.
