За	HMICFRS Update	DCC updated. Re-launch of HMIC VAWG process, so data set re- done. Force needs to improve crime data integrity and has identified key area of improvement in Force Control Room. Six-months of new training sessions rolled out and improvement noted with 100% compliance in last month on ASB audits. Discussion over N100 Rape reporting which showed adherence as poor. New action plan devised within Force Control Room and Protecting Vulnerable People (PVP). Next focus on Violence. Issues are currently discussed at monthly Victim Focus meetings and will continue to do so. PCC asked about vetting and counter corruption inspection in April. DCC stated that of 34 recommendations, two were national issues. In tackling misogyny, Force launched 'Know the Line' campaign and identified Bad Apple system as another tool to tackle issue. Custody reports are critical. Force has more frequent custody board meetings to consider performance, Power BI assists this. Force highlighted for exceptional Right Care Right Person (RCRP) work and have been asked for inputs to be pushed out nationally.
